Thank to all the volunteers who joined us and made the for the Civil War Weekend a success. People are starting to know about Peterboro's wonderful history.
Well, we have had another eventful year!

On September 16th, 1995 Congressman Boehlert had a Town Hall Meeting at the Community Center. Congressman Boehlert had an open floor for the people of the area. We also had the pleasure of having Barbara Tagger, a historian from the National Park Service, we gave her the grand tour of Peterboro and she spoke on the Underground Railroad route and also that the Land office is also on the list for a National Landmark site. Just recently we have heard that all the materials have been presented to Congress. Judge Hugh Humphrey's also spoke, he shared information about an abolitionist meeting that was held in Peterboro. The Town Hall meeting was very informative.

On November 3rd, the Smithfield Community Association had a reception to honor all the people who were involved in getting the Community Center on the National Historic Register. Our thanks went out to Nell Zeigler, Richard Carlson and Michael Tomlan. Please take a look, the National Historic Register plaque is now on the building. Bill Magee read Peterboro's Bicentennial Resolution which was written by our town historian Donna Burdick, and passed in the State Assembly. Copies of the resolution were made on parchment paper and are on sale.
