

Reenactors Information & Event Rules

Peterboro Civil War Weekend – June 12 - 13, 2010

Thank you for participating in our event and helping us to raise funds for local historic preservation. Without the re-enactors there would be no Civil War Weekend. Any re-enactor issues during the event please see Mrs. Carol Mayers or Bvt. Sgt Major MacMillan of the 12th US Co. A..

The standard **rules of camp** and field are in effect. **They are to be respected and obeyed.** Anyone acting in an unsafe manner will be asked to leave immediately. **Safety is number one!** USV Safety rules will be strictly observed.

The hosts reserve the right to disallow any item, person, or activity deemed unsafe or inappropriate.

Reenactors must receive prior permission from the organizers for any fund raising activities/raffles they wish to conduct during the event.

Weapons & Battlefield

- No participant under the age of 16 will be allowed to carry or fire any firearm or serve on any cannon crew. No participant under the age of 12 years will be allowed on the field during the battles. Participants 12 – 15 years of age must be a functional musician, certified and assigned by the Chief of Music, or a messenger to be on the field or flag bearers. A parent or guardian who is responsible for him/her for the weekend must accompany that person.
- No loaded pistols. Only officers can carry pistols

Authenticity

- **Civilians** must be in period attire if remaining in the camps during the weekend. No hoop skirts around the fire. No nail polish, wristwatches, or 21st century makeup. Eyewear should be as close as possible. All reenactors should be in period costume from 8:30 am to 5 pm on Saturday and 8:30 am – 4 pm on Sunday.
- All women serving in the ranks will make a determined effort to disguise the fact that they are female. This is historically accurate. Let's not insult their memories.

Schedules

- **Skirmish** both days at 2:00 pm. **Sunday church service** by Tim MacNamarra will be at 10:30 am at the west end tent.
- **Concert** by the 77th Regimental Balladeers & Irish Volunteers, Saturday, June 12, 2010 8:00 PM in the Smithfield Community Center – upstairs. Refreshments available for a donation. Please contact registration for complimentary concert tickets for reenactors

Camps

- An authentic Union and Confederate camp will be established. No wall or fly tents will be allowed on company streets. All modern items and equipment will be kept out of the public view during the event. (Put your Dunkin Donuts coffee in a period cup please.)
- All **fire pits** must have water buckets and a shovel by them at all times. Fires shall not be left unattended at any time. No trash is to be placed into the pits, and pits must be filled in before you leave camp Sunday.

Reenactors Information & Event Rules

Peterboro Civil War Weekend – June 12 - 13, 2010

- **Water location** – Confederate camp near the split rail fence, Union camp – 3rd house (white house) from southwest corner of Park St. and Pleasant Valley Rd. Sutlers – the west side of the General Store.
- Please refrain from striking camp before event scheduled closing time unless prior arrangements are made with organizers.

Parking

- All **vehicles** will be out of Camp and off Pleasant Valley Road by **9:15 am**. Parking is located behind the Smithfield Community Center. Please park on ball field. Any arrivals after that time must carry their gear in. If you need handicap parking please contact Beth Spokowsky at 315-684-9022 before the event to make arrangements.

Registration

- Registration will take place on the corner of Oxbow Rd and Elizabeth Street, Jody Luce's front porch. Registration will be open on Friday from 2:30 pm—8:00 pm and on Saturday from 8:00 am—9:30 am. Registration during event hours will be at the main gate. **Please register before setting up camp.**

Horses, dogs and other animals

- Horse must have proper paperwork – Coggins and Rabies.
- Dogs must have proof of rabies or they will not be let into the event. All animals must have adequate food and water during the weekend. All dogs must be kept on a leash no longer than 6 feet at all times.
