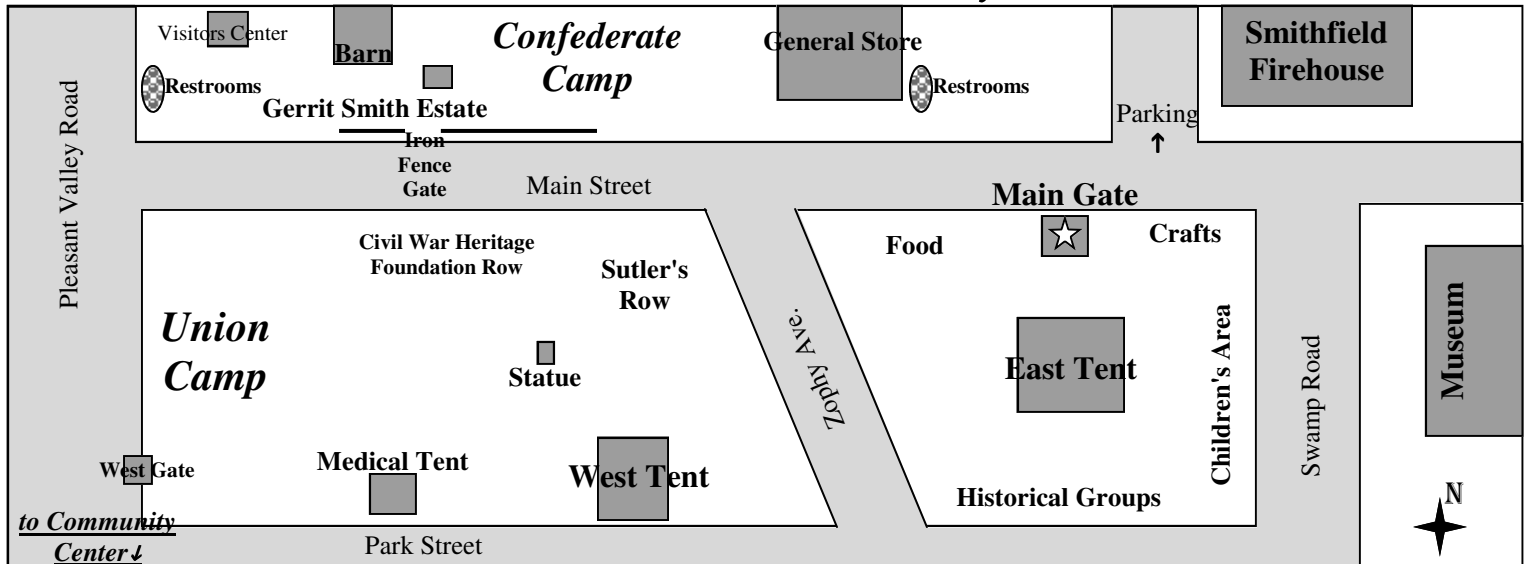


18TH ANNUAL CIVIL WAR WEEKEND
